Education Afloat

Grades K-8 (full-day or half-day)

May & June only

Full-day: includes On Water AND On Land
(or choose between two On Land Activities)

Half-day: includes either On Water OR On Land

Anchors Aweigh! Students experience Toronto's waterfront on an hour-long expedition through the Inner Harbour and island lagoons aboard a fully-enclosed Transport Canada Marine Safety inspected vessel. A life jacket drill is conducted prior to departure. Teachers may choose from a variety of grade-appropriate activities to complement the boat exploration. Students focus on one of the following topics: Community (Grades K-3), Environment (Grades 4-8) or Geography/History (Grades 7-8). Students study changing land usage and the natural and human impact on the waterfront environment. Call to discuss your options.

Choose any two options to make up a full-day or choose one option for a half-day.

IMPORTANT! Education Afloat Safety Notice:

Harbourfront Centre, as well as passenger vessel operators hold liability insurance. Prior to a voyage, departure safety announcements are required which include a demonstration of how to wear a lifejacket and the locations of life saving devices. All vessels are Transport Canada Marine Safety inspected annually and carry sufficient life saving apparatus for the maximum number of permitted passengers. All vessels are operated by Transport Canada Marine Safety certified captains and crew. Testing to obtain such certificates includes, but is not limited to; medical fitness, marine emergency training, first aid and navigation. Captains monitor regularly updated radio forecasts and determine if the weather is suitable for a voyage based on information from Environment Canada.
