

Rocks of the Great Lakes Gene Threndyle

Ontario is the only jurisdiction that has shoreline on all the Great Lakes and all of waterways flowing between them. They are the major geographical feature of this place and the largest system of fresh water lakes in the world. They have a geological history that goes back to the earliest periods of Earth's existence. This exhibition looks to rocks collected on each of the great lakes not only to see the past and the present but also the future.

Gene Threndyle is an artist/gardener who has worked in Toronto for over 20 years. His work has been included in the *Wade Project* and exhibited at the Art Gallery at Glendon College in Toronto. He has been part of *The Artists' Gardens* at Harbourfront Centre for over 10 years and has been published by George Brown University. In 2006 he was a feature garden writer for the Toronto Sunday Star.
